

## **Listing of Development and Training Completed by Board Members**

All Illinois school board members must receive training in the *Open Meetings Act* (P.A. 97-504), *Professional Development Leadership*, and the *Performance Evaluation Reform Act* (P.A. 97-08). Mandatory training will also be required after the new teacher evaluation requirements are implemented in each school district.

The *Open Meetings Act* training requirements refer to general applicability, procedures, and legal requirements. It also requires Board members who have completed the training requirement to file a copy of their certificate of completion with the School Board. Members taking office after January 1, 2012 must complete this training no later than 90 days after taking the oath of office

A minimum of 4 hours of *Professional Development Leadership (PDLT)* training is required, including: education and labor law, financial oversight and accountability, and fiduciary responsibilities. This also requires school districts to post on their websites the names of all Board members who have successfully completed the training. Every Board member elected for a term beginning after June 13, 2011, and every Board member appointed after June 13, 2011 to fill a vacancy of at least one year's duration must complete the training within the first year of the Board member's first term.

Effective June 13, 2011 a training program on *Performance Evaluation Reform Act (PERA)* evaluations is also required. School board members who participate in a vote on a dismissal based upon an "optional alternative evaluative" dismissal process for PERA evaluations must have this training.

The following table contains mandatory and non-mandatory training and development activities that were completed by each Board member. When the training was provided by the Illinois Association of School Boards, the acronym "IASB" follows the listed activity.
