Hagan Scholarship Foundation- (multiple renewable scholarships up to \$10000 per school year) Applicants must have 3.5 cumulative GPA, 23 or higher ACT score, or 1200 or higher SAT Composite, enroll in a four-year college for the fall semester following high school graduation, work 240 hours in the 12 months prior to the start of the academic year of college, & complete the FAFSA in 2017 and have a FAFSA EFC of less than \$6500. www.hsfmo.org any specific questions can be emailed to scholarships@hsfmo.org Deadline: **November 15th** (This is a big scholarship and Central has had a recipient of this scholarship the past 2 school year's)

Elks Most Valuable Student Scholarship- This scholarship is open to any high school senior and is based on scholarship, leadership and financial need. Apply online at <http://www.elks.org/scholars/scholarships/mvs.cfm> and must be submitted on or before **Nov. 27th**.

Scholarships for Elks Families- There are also several scholarships on the website for family member of Elks or deceased Elks members. Deadlines vary.

CBAI Foundation for Community Banking- \$1000 a year for up to four years of higher education will be awarded to the author of the best essay about the importance of community banking submitted by a high school senior.
